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Admission criteria	Progressive life-limiting disease (malignant or non-malignant) requiring specialist consultation.
Referral process	Inpatient referrals – Inpatient referral process – log in to SCGH referral system and complete required information for medical eReferral. Outpatient referrals – If the referral is from an external referrer (eg a GP), use the Centralised Referral Service, or book via telephone or fax to the Palliative Care Service.
