Service profile	 Consultancy service and outpatient clinic within adult tertiary public hospital. Comprehensive medical, nursing and allied health care based on the unique needs of the patient, carer and family when facing a life limiting prognosis, including: Symptom assessment and management Addressing emotional and social concerns Coordinating care from hospital to community Providing quality care for patients towards the end of life Assistance with clinical decision making Bereavement support. Assistance is provided with discharge, access to community inpatient beds and liaison with palliative care services in regional WA.

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Admission criteria	Progressive life-limiting disease (malignant or non-malignant) requiring specialist consultation.
Referral process	Inpatient referrals – Inpatient referral process – log in to SCGH referral system and complete required information for medical eReferral. Outpatient referrals – If the referral is from an external referrer (eg a GP), use the Centralised Referral Service, or book via telephone or fax to the Palliative Care Service. Palliative care discharge criteria	Based on discretion of the Palliative Care Service in discussion with the primary team.
Outpatient clinic	Symptom Assessment Clinic – Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings.
Niche services	 The Lotus Room – a space specifically designed to provide a peaceful and home-like environment for patients and families receiving terminal care. SolarisCare – Cancer support centre provides complementary therapies including aromatherapy, massage, Reiki, pranic healing and reflexology for inpatients and outpatients. Bi-annual memorial service.
